SECTION 4: First-aid measures

If inhaled

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment, and emergency procedures

Keep unnecessary personnel away. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Keep out of low areas. Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during cleanup. Do not breathe dust. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Ensure adequate ventilation. Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Wet down and dike the spilled material where this is possible. Stop leak if it can be done without risk. Shovel material into waste container. If sweeping of contaminated area is necessary, use a dust suppressant agent that does not react with the product. Collect dust using a vacuum cleaner equipped with a HEPA filter. Minimize dust generation and accumulation. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements, or confined areas. Following product recovery, flush area with water to remove residual contamination. Never return spills to original containers for reuse. Contaminated absorbent material may pose the same hazards as the spilled product. In the event of a spill or accidental release, notify relevant authorities in accordance with all applicable regulations.
